Recipients of funding from The Dick and Pip Smith Leadership Through Adventure Fund were celebrated and recognised at a special function held in the Nat Shack at AJ 2025.

Among those present were a patrol of Bribie Island Venturers, led by Charlie Atkins, who received funding for an adventurous journey that had them hiking across K'gari/Fraser Island.

Their journey took them across 35km of the 120km length of this World Heritage Listed Island that sits off the south-eastern coastline of the Wide Bay Burnett Region of Queensland.

Charlie explained that they hiked through the soft sands of the world's largest sand island; learning about the island's heritage along the way including how there had once been significant logging of redwood trees in the centre.

The LTAF enabled the small group to not worry about any cost as it covered ferry transfer from the mainland, all their food and even some new hiking pants for the patrol in preparation for this soft sand adventure.

"At the end of our journey, we have to submit a report back to the LTAF Committee that showed what we did" Charlie said. "The process of applying is pretty simple and the committee were really excited for us".
