A Camping Standard Award acknowledges excellence in outdoor living, focusing on health and hygiene, Unit morale, tentage, and campsite management. High standards of health and hygiene are crucial, including regular handwashing, proper waste disposal, and maintaining clean sanitation facilities. Boosting morale is essential, with activities that promote teamwork, resilience, and a positive camp atmosphere. Tentage should be well-pitched, stable, and secure, using the correct pegs and guy lines, and the inside of a tent should be clean and tidy. Lastly, campsite management involves maintaining a tidy and organised site, with designated areas for sleeping, cooking, and activities, as well as ensuring clear pathways and effective litter control. These criteria together create a safe, clean, and enjoyable camping experience for all participants.

Cheeli Awards Best Sub-camp Gateway

Cheeli subcamp presented Gateway awards on Sunday (12th Jan) and the first one to be presented was a gateway they considered the best. The award went to C048!

The gateway was designed by Mudgeeraba Venturer Liam Le Couteur who spent 3 months (a whole school term) designing the gateway and through trial and error and a few ideas knocked back by his JSL was happy with the design and the way his Unit pulled together to build it.

"I wanted it to be big, beautiful and with lots of moving parts" Liam laughed "and I think I succeeded. I hope others like it too".

The gateway is by far the tallest in the Cheeli sub camp with JSL Koro wanting it to be seen from the mall so he knew where his camp was amongst the tent city. It features a rotating boom gate and a large frame on either side of the gateway with the unit sign hung proudly above the gate and lighting on the high uprights as a beacon to aim for when navigating in the dark.

But Liam and his merry band of Scouting engineers aren't satisfied with just building it and letting it shine - they are always tweaking something or adding another item to their gateway and the camp itself. "Pioneering is my thing in scouting" he explains "I enjoy it more than anything else."

This is the second award for Unit C048 who also received a QLD Contingent camping award earlier in the Jamboree. Liam is hoping he can hold on to this award though. "This is extremely cool, it looks great and if I get to take it home its going to look even better sitting on my shelf."

The question on everyone's lips who traverse past the gateway though seems to be "When will you stop working on your gateway?" Liam laughs as he answers "probably the day we pull it down to leave".
